What is the Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check?


The Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check is an assessment required by the government. The purpose of the check is to determine whether your child can fluently recall their times tables up to 12×12 , which is essential for future success in mathematics.

How is the check carried out?

It is an on-screen check consisting of 25 times table questions. Your child will be able to answer 3 practice questions before taking the actual check. They will then have 6 seconds to answer each question. On average, the check should take no longer than 5 minutes to complete.



When does it take place?

The Multiplication Tables Check will be carried out during June. Your child's teacher will organise the day and time of the assessment and will assist the children to complete the assessment individually or in a small group.

How can I help my child prepare?

Your child will be learning their times tables as part of the mathematics curriculum, however to have a fluent, fast and accurate recall, they must practise regularly at school and at home.

In class children practise weekly using a web based Multiplication Tables Checker program to help them prepare for using the official one in June. Your child will be able to show you their weekly results, which will enable you to identify which specific times tables they need to practise.
